



## Mary L. Campbell

Mary Lane Campbell of Easton, MD, formerly of Preston, MD, died on Wednesday, January 26, 2005 at Genesis Eldercare – The Pines, Easton. She was 96.

Born March 28, 1908, she was the daughter of the late Edward V. and Mary C. Wright Lane. After graduating from Preston High School in 1925, she attended Towson State Normal School and the University of Maryland where she earned a B.S. Degree. She taught for two years at Friendship and then took a teaching position at Preston, retiring after thirty-six years. Her motto for the children was “Strive to Excel”. Her career touched the lives of several generations of Preston community children which she loved.

Her husband of 68 years, Paul W. Campbell, whom she married November 29, 1933, died on January 25, 2002. She lived near Preston all of her life until moving to Easton in 1998 to live with her daughter.

The oldest living member of Bethesda United Methodist Church in Preston, having joined in 1920, she helped with the activities of the church and seldom missed a service. She was also actively involved with the National and Caroline County Teacher’s Associations, the Preston Community Club, Academy of The Arts, and Daughters of America. In 1969 she was awarded an honorary Life Membership by the Maryland Congress of Parents and

Teachers in recognition of outstanding service to children.

Mrs. Campbell is survived by her daughter, Elaine C. Altvater of Trappe; three grandchildren, David, Susan and Anne; and six great-grandchildren.
