



Mary Margaret Hammer

June 27, 1918 - February 23, 2011

Mary Margaret Hammer of Centreville, MD died at the Genesis Eldercare-The Pines, Easton, MD on Wednesday, February 23, 2011. She was 92.

Born June 27, 1918 in Cumberland, MD, she was the daughter of the late Edward Francis and Katie Treiber Lible. She graduated from Alleghany High School of Cumberland in the Class of 1936. She married Ralph C. Hammer of Cumberland, MD on June 6, 1942 and they moved to Annapolis to raise their family. Mrs. Hammer became a secretary to the Director of the Department of Legislative Reference in Annapolis, retiring in 1981. In 1972, they moved to Stevensville and later to Centreville, MD. Mr. Hammer died June 18, 2006.

She worked as a volunteer for the Anne Arundel General Hospital and later became a volunteer for Queen Anne's Hospice, Inc.

Mrs. Hammer is survived by a son, Dr. Edward C. Hammer of Centreville, MD; two daughters, Holly Hagelin of Stevensville, MD and Christine Wolff of Kill Devil Hill, NC; five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
