



Mattie Jarman Anthony

June 16, 1905 - December 21, 2009

Mattie Anthony died on Monday, December 21, 2009 at Corsica Hills Nursing Home in Centreville, MD. She was 104 years old.

Martha Jarman was born near Sudlersville, MD on June 16, 1905, the youngest daughter of William A. and Lydia Smith Jarman. She was preceded in death by her husband, Charles E. Anthony, a son, Charles Jr., and two sisters, Blanche Smith and Rebecca Coleman.

She is survived by a daughter, Betty Lee and her husband, Joseph Jackson, Jr. and six grandchildren, Martha Anthony, Charles Anthony III, Carol Morter, Catherine Yurewicz, Cynthia Hudson, James Cooper, Jr., twelve great-grandchildren and two great, great-grandchildren.

Mattie was a lifelong resident of Queen Anne's County. She was a graduate of Sudlersville High School, Class of 1922, a graduate of Towson Normal School and began a teaching career. Because of the dire need for teachers, she returned to Towson and earned her B.S. degree in 1949. She spent many years at Queenstown Elementary and was the Principal until the school closed in 1968. She was always an active member of the Centreville United Methodist Church. She was a member of the Delta Kappa Gamma, American Legion Auxiliary, Woman's Club, Town & Country, and the Retired Teacher's Association.
