



## Max Christopher Sherman

August 25, 1925 - December 16, 2009

Max Christopher Sherman, Jr., a World War II veteran and lifelong resident of the Eastern Shore, died on December 16, 2009 at the Hospice of Queen Anne's. He was 84 years old.

Born on August 25, 1925, at Wye Ferry in Queenstown, he remained a lover of boats, the Chesapeake Bay, and local waterways, which he enjoyed until recent years. A graduate of Centreville High School, Mr. Sherman enlisted in the US Coast Guard in 1943, where he spent three years, including an assignment on the USS PF 25 Charlottesville in the Pacific. In 1949, he married Elizabeth Jones, with whom he celebrated 60 years of marriage in September.

He graduated from the University of Maryland in 1951 and joined the Eastern Shore Estates Company in Centreville, a company he later bought and owned for 38 years.

After living in Centreville for 25 years, Mr. and Mrs. Sherman moved to Wye Ferry, where they lived for 12 years before moving to Chestertown in 1999.

In addition to his wife, he leaves a daughter, Susan Stendahl, and her husband, Daniel of Ipswich, Massachusetts; two sons, Max C. Sherman, III and his wife, Mary of Charleston, South Carolina, and James P. Sherman and his wife, Patty of Centreville; and eight grandchildren. He was predeceased by sisters, Betty, Jean, Fran, and Lil.
