



Mearl Herbert Kemberling

July 17, 1942 - July 31, 2020

Mearl H. Kemberling of Stevensville, MD, died at his home, Friday, July 31, 2020. He was 78.

Born in Everett, PA, on July 17, 1942, he was the son of the late John H. and Bertha Margaret Adams Kemberling. He graduated from Everett High, Valedictorian and went to Penn State, specialized in Geology and Ceramics; served in Army ROTC, and stationed in Germany as Munitions Officer. He went to California and worked in computers, ceramics, mortgages and property appraisals. When he moved to Maryland, he began a 20-year career in telecommunications before retiring in 2019.

Mearl is survived by his loving wife, Diane Kraft Kemberling; sons, John, Adam and Jesse Perkins Natal, wife Katia Perkins Natale Sejas; granddaughter, Michelle, David Lee Natale; fiancé, Kathleen and younger sister, Mary Kemberling Gundlach and husband Robert Gundlach. His older sister, Sarah Kunz, is deceased.
