



## Michael Warren Gibson

March 16, 1944 - October 16, 2013

Michael W. Gibson, 69, of Easton, MD, died on Wednesday, October 16, 2013, at the Envoy at Denton from complications of multiple strokes. Mike was born in Washington, DC, on March 16, 1944. He was the son of the late George Roland Gibson and Gertrude Estelle Milstead Gibson of Port Tobacco, MD.

He graduated from Bladensburg High School in 1963. He was employed as a sheet metal mechanic until entering the United States Army in 1965. He served in France and Germany and returned to sheet metal work upon receiving his Honorable Discharge. Later, using his military experience, he went into the private security field where he met and married Rae Louise Rogers. They continued together in life and work until her retirement and subsequent death. Mike carried on as a security guard until his own retirement and later decline. He was a quiet, tenacious, hard worker all his life, and he faced his demise in the same admirable way.

In addition to his mother, Mike is survived by Louise's children and grandchildren; his brothers, George and Kevin, and their wives, Maria and Mary and their children, Mike, Matt, Chris, Patrick, and Carly. In addition to his father and wife; he was preceded in death by a sister-in-law, Ellen Anne Gibson.

A funeral liturgy will be celebrated on Wednesday, October 23, 2013, at 11 a.m. at St. Ignatius Catholic Church - Chapel Point, 8855 Chapel Point RD, Port Tobacco, MD, 20677. A visitation will be held at the church from 10:30 to 11 a.m. Interment will follow in the church cemetery.
