Mildred Davis Ludwig of Earleville, MD died at her home Saturday, February 21, 2009. She was 87,

Mildred D. Ludwig was born Jan. 10, 1922 in Winchendon, Mass., the daughter of the late James Corbett Davis and Steelman "Sallie" Taylor. Mrs. Ludwig attended schools in Pennsylvania and Delaware. She graduated from Newark High School in 1939 and graduated from the University of Delaware with a bachelors of Arts and Science degree in 1943. In 1964 she also received a master's degree in secondary education. In 1946 she married Leonard L. Ludwig. The couple lived in Newark, DE and then moved to Earleville, MD. Mrs. Ludwig worked as a teacher and scientist. She received a technical award of science during WWII for her work on the Manhattan Project. Mrs. Ludwig helped start the Save the Bay Foundation and help start the grass roots movement as well and became known as the "Swamp Lady" to friends and neighbors. She enjoyed teaching, working with the Girl Scouts and helping with many environmental causes.

Mrs. Ludwig is survived by one daughter Sharon L. Wiedmann and husband Rich of Cedar Grove, NC, one son Eric W. Ludwig and wife Robin of Earleville, MD, one grandson, Mark Wiedmann and wife Corrie and two great grandchildren, Trey and Taylor Wiedmann of Wake Forest, NC
