



Nancy Waddell Shuck

September 8, 1929 - January 18, 2025

Nancy Waddell Shuck died peacefully in Easton Maryland on January 18th, 2025 with her daughters by her side. Born September 8th, 1929, Nancy was the oldest of three children born to Grace Bond and William Francis Waddell, Nancy attended Chatham Women's College where her impressive creative talents were put to good use designing, sewing and painting costumes and sets for college productions. After school she met and married Albert "Mike" Porter Hill Jr. and moved to Fox Chapel, PA to raise her three girls. Tory Enerson, now of Columbia, MD, Dria Boyer, now of Morris, CT. and Abby Vogel, now of East Hampton, NY. Summers were spent beachcombing on her beloved Cape Cod.

Nancy was a prominent member of the Pittsburgh chapter of the Junior League and in her thirties obtained her real estate license. Following her divorce she became an active real estate agent in the Pittsburgh area. At 46 Nancy met and married Donald Lockhart Shuck, expanding her family to include Don Jr., now of New York City and Sally Simpson of Stratton, VT. The family relocated to Sewickley, PA where Nancy immersed herself in the local community, joining the garden club, becoming an avid golfer, and with three friends opening a knitting shop "Yarns Unlimited". Upon Don's retirement they moved briefly to Pinehurst, NC, finally settling in Easton in 2004. They both fell in love with all aspects of the Eastern Shore. Nancy pursued her lifelong passion of

watercolor painting, joining the Art Academy, and continued her work with The Garden Club of America. Throughout their 48-year marriage Don and Nancy traveled extensively all over the world. She is survived by her sister Barbara Burgin of Exter, NH, her five children, eleven grandchildren and six great grandchildren.
