



## Nancy Hepbron Stanton

December 11, 1915 - October 23, 2016

Nancy Hepbron Schreiber Stanton, Chesapeake City, MD, passed away on October 23, 2016, at Autumn Lake Healthcare in Chestertown, MD. She was 100 years old.

Born on December 11, 1915, in Still Pond, MD, she was the daughter of the late William Jackson and Grace Ringgold Price Hepbron. She graduated from Chestertown High School, Class of 1933 and later attended Cecil Community College. She married Alexander Tutton Schreiber, who predeceased her in 1971, and later remarried in 1976 to Russell Crom Stanton, who predeceased in 2004.

Mrs. Stanton is survived by her daughter, Mary Catharine Cooling of Chesapeake City, MD; a granddaughter, Mary Heather Miller of Cecilton, MD; and a great-grandson, Colton William Miller. She is also survived by her sister, Mary Alice Coleman of Australia.

In addition to her first and second husband, she was predeceased by her sister, Catharine Hepbron Harris in January of 2016 and her brother, William Jackson Hepbron, Jr.
