



Nicholas T. Barry

May 26, 1919 - September 13, 2010

Nicholas Thomas Barry passed away on September 13, 2010. He was 91 years old.

Born in Philadelphia on May 26, 1919, he was the son of the late, Nicholas T. and Blanche Wolf Barry. A proud member of the 1937 Class of Ambler High School, he went on to earn a B.A. in Social Studies Teaching from Ursinus College. He also spent two years at the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania. Mr. Barry worked for Asbestos Erectors, as a general manager, and the Exxon Company, USA in the Administrative Services Department.

At the time of his death, he was a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church. He was an elder in Presbyterian Churches in Annapolis, Houston, TX, Basking Ridge, Plainfield and Bound Brook, NJ.

A recipient of the Purple Heart, Mr. Barry was a decorated World War II Veteran, who served in the Mediterranean Theatre from 1942 – 1946 in the 363d Infantry Regiment, 91st Infantry Division.

He is survived by his loving wife, Jean E. Barry, whom he married on May 10, 1952; his daughter, Ellen Barry Grunden of Easton; his grandson, Nicholas Wilson Grunden, a senior at St. Andrew's School; and a cherished niece, Susan Angstadt of Oakland, CA. In addition to his parents, he was preceded

in death by his brother, Henry W. Barry, who died in 1984, and his sister, Betty Angstadt, who died in 2001.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, September 18, 2010 at 2:00 pm at the William Hill Manor Auditorium.
