



## Olive K. Stavelly

December 29, 1923 - June 19, 2009

Olive Kanaly Stavelly of Easton died at the Salisbury Rehabilitation & Nursing Center in Salisbury, MD on Friday, June 19, 2009. She was 85.

Mrs. Stavelly was born in Philadelphia, PA on December 29, 1923. She graduated from school in the Philadelphia area. During WWII, she worked as a key punch operator for a Philadelphia bank. She married David M. Stavelly on September 21, 1946. They lived in various places throughout Maryland, and in the mid 1950's settled in Easton. Mrs. Stavelly worked as a clerk for many years at Rowen's Stationery Store. She also volunteered at the Easton Memorial Hospital Commission Shop, and St. Mark's Thrift Shop.

Mrs. Stavelly was a member of St. Marks United Methodist Church, where she loved to care for the young children while their parents attended Sunday Worship Services. In addition, she was a member of the ladies auxiliary of the E.E.Streets Memorial Post 5118 V.F.W. of Easton, and a former member of the Eastern Star. As a young woman, she loved to play volleyball at the Y.M.C.A.

In addition to her husband, Mrs.Stavelly is survived by a son, David McKay Stavelly, Jr. and his wife, Debbie, of Salisbury, MD; a daughter, Jean D. Stavelly of Berlin, MD; two grandchildren, David M. Stavelly III of Newport News, VA and Ian Scott Stavelly of Hampton, VA. She was preceded in death

by two brothers, John Kanaly and Leonard Kanaly.
