June 30, 1920 - December 7, 2009

Otis Amos Brown died on Monday, December 07, 2009 at the Envoy of Denton. He was 89.

Otis was born on June 30, 1920 in Stevensville, MD to the late, William Oscar Brown and Mildred A. Thompkins. He grew up in Stevensville and at the age of 12, his family moved to Linthicum, MD. He married June Beauchamp in May 1939 in Baltimore, MD and they had 3 children. He was drafted into the US Army during WWII, serving from 1944 to 1945 under General Patton. He was in the Battle of the Bulge. He was awarded the Bronze Star, Silver Star, and Purple Heart for his service. After he was honorably discharged, he moved back to Baltimore and drove a cab and was a truck driver for many years. In 1963 he opened his own body shop, General Auto Repair. He retired after 17 years, in 1980. He married Mary Belle in 1951 in Baltimore, MD. In 1961 they made their home in Grasonville.

Otis loved boating, cooking, working on Mustang cars, yard sales, cigars, and socializing with his friends at Hardees. He was known to his family and friends as a charmer who was outgoing and friendly.

Otis is survived by his six children, Kay "Susie" Brown Sprague and her husband Ronald of Green Bay, WI, Otis "Buddy" Brown, Jr of Green Bay, WI, Michael F Brown and his wife Judy of Smithburg, MD, Danny Brown and his

wife Mary Lee of Grasonville, MD, Penny Russell and her husband Robert of Queenstown, MD, Joseph Brown and his wife Melanie Casey of Millington, MD; 17 grandchildren and 28 great grandchildren; sister, Beverly Haller of Baltimore, MD, Uncle Ed Seitz of Baltimore, MD. He was preceded in death by his wife Mary Belle, and his four brothers, William, George, Calvin and Donald; 2 sisters, Kay Seitz and Elizabeth Brown.
