



## Pamela Parker Michael

November 5, 1937 - December 11, 2009

Pamela Parker Michael, of Kent County Maryland, near Chestertown, died of complications from Crohn's disease on December 11, 2009, at the University of Maryland Medical Center, Baltimore, Maryland. She was seventy-two.

Descended from South Carolina's Cunningham family, she was born in Westchester County, New York, the daughter of Sanford "Sandy" Parker and Virginia Hubbard Parker of Hawaii. She was named Ann Pamela Parker after her forebear, Ann Pamela Cunningham, the forerunner of historic preservation who created the Mount Vernon Ladies Association and saved George Washington's home from decay and development.

Raised in Hawaii, living on O'ahu at Wahiawa and at Mokuleia on the North Shore, Pamela was educated at Punahou School in Honolulu and Endicott College, Massachusetts.

Her marriage in Hawaii to Thomas Chambers Young II ended in divorce after which she continued to travel widely. Pamela's calling was that of an accomplished artist, in fact and in spirit, expressing herself through countless media and a rich life devoted to conservation and beauty in places as New Orleans, Louisiana; West Point, New York; Washington, D.C.; Kansas; New Mexico; California; Honolulu; and Alamos in Sonora, Mexico. Pamela came to marry Louis Guy Michael at Chestertown, Maryland, in 2007.

In addition to her husband, Pamela is survived by a brother, Robert Hunter Parker; two sons, Thomas Sanford Young and Andrew Furness Young; three step-children, Barbara Michael Bradley, Louis Guy Michael, III, and John Emory Michael; two grandchildren, Parker and Kelly Rose; six step-grandchildren, Brendan, John, Margaret, Catherine, Mischa, and Reilley; her sister-in-law, Cheryl Parker; nieces Michelle and Hillery; and her nephew, Hunter Parker.

Ashes and dust will be reposed in the Memorial Garden at Old Saint Paul's, Kent, following a Holy Requiem Eucharist at high noon on December 22, 2009, at the oldest Episcopal Church on the Eastern Shore. Subsequently, in 2010, there will be memorial ceremony at the Royal Birthing Stones, Kukaniloko, O'ahu; one of Hawaii's most sacred important historical places.
