September 23, 1924 - October 11, 2013

Patricia Rae Foley of Stevensville, MD, died Friday, October 11, 2013, at Anne Arundel Medical Center. She was 89.

Born in Detroit, MI, on September 23, 1924, she was the daughter of the late Dewitt C. and Ellen Celeste Diamond Whitman. She served in the U.S. Navy during WWII, when she met and married the love of her life Michael Edward Foley on November 7, 1945. They resided in Washington, DC, until 1977, when they moved to Stevensville, MD, Mr. Foley died in 2005.

During her career, Mrs. Foley was an information specialist and a labor liaison for the Public Health Service.
