



## Patricia Jane Molloy

August 17, 1946 - March 29, 2016

Patricia Jane Molloy of Chestertown, MD, died peacefully March 29 at the University of Maryland-Baltimore Shock/Trauma Center. She had been in the Center for several weeks following a serious car accident.

Patricia was born August 17, 1946 ,in Brooklyn, NY, first child of John and Marie Molloy. She was a graduate of the Dominican Academy, Skidmore College, and Georgetown University. Most of her career was spent with General Motors, either in extensive traveling or at home in Detroit and Grosse Pointe, MI.

In 1999, she and her husband William “Bill” Quigley retired and moved to Chestertown.

Patricia had four loves, her family, her friends, classic films, and good literature. She particularly found great joy in teaching a film course for many years sponsored by Washington College Academy of Lifelong Learning and was known to many in Chestertown as the “Movie Lady,” a sobriquet that always made her smile.
