



## Peggy Ann Barnhart

September 15, 1936 - October 1, 2009

Peggy Ann Barnhart of St. Michaels, MD died October 1, 2009 at home. She was 73.

Born September 15, 1936 in Breathedsville, MD (near Hagerstown, MD), she was the daughter of the late, Millard Raymond and Mabel Myers Miller.

Peggy was a 1954 graduate of Hagerstown High School. For the majority of her life, Peggy was a homemaker and mother. She was a volunteer and advocate supporting the education of the children in the community and schools.
