



Penny M. Cannon

February 24, 1943 - January 15, 2011

Penny M. Cannon died at the University of Maryland Medical Center on January 15, 2011. She was 67 years old.

Born in Easton on February 24, 1943, she was the daughter of Lewis Ferguson and Frances W. Wilkerson Ferguson. She was a member of the first class to graduate from Saints Peter and Paul High School in 1962. On February 12, 1966, she married Larry Neal Cannon, Sr., and they made their home in Easton. She started her career with Talbot County Public Schools, and then worked at the Benedictine School, helping children with disabilities. She continued her career as a case worker for PSI in Washington, DC.

After her retirement, Mrs. Cannon found herself still wanting to work as a volunteer for the Memorial Hospital at Easton. She loved working with children, shopping, knitting and going out to lunch. Most of all, she enjoyed time spent with her family, especially her mother in-law and grandchildren. She was a friend to all, volunteering her time to anyone who needed her help. She was a kind and loving wife, mother, and friend, who will be missed by all who knew her.

She is survived by her husband, Larry Neal Cannon, Sr.; her children, Maryanne Izaguirre (Stephen) of Preston, Buddy Cannon (Stephanie) of Davidsonville, MD, and Beth Whitby (Michael) of Federalsburg; and her

grandchildren, Brogan Cannon, Blake Cannon, Jacob Whitby, Nicholas Cannon, Becca Cannon, Kayla Whitby, and Seth Whitby. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her brothers, Louis Ferguson and David Ferguson.

A memorial service will be held at 10:00 am on Tuesday, January 25 at Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Easton, where Mrs. Cannon had been a member.

Burial will be private.
