Philip Scott Thomas of Chestertown, MD, died on Saturday, January 30, 2016, at Corsica Hills Center in Centreville, MD. He was 67.

Mr. Thomas was born July 9, 1948, in Baltimore, MD, the son of the late David Ivor Thomas and Helen Hardisky Thomas. Scotty was a 1966 graduate of PolyTech High School in Baltimore and a 1970 graduate of West Virginia Wesleyan College.

He worked most of his life in trucking and bus sales in the Baltimore area. He was a member of the Buick Car Club and enjoyed collecting antique cars and model trains. Mr. Thomas was widely read in the transportation field.
