Philip K. Newcomb of Easton, MD died on Saturday, September 24, 2005 at Genesis Eldercare-The Pines, Easton. He was 84.

Born December 5, 1920 in Laurel, MD, he was the son of the late John W. and Lillian Tall Newcomb. During World War II he served in the U.S. Army Air Corps. During his working years, he was head sales manager for A&P Tea Company in Pittsburgh, PA and then served as Vice President of Don Irwin Food, Inc, also in Pittsburgh, until retiring in 1982.

“The Mayor” as he was fondly known by many, embraced life on the Choptank and his many friends. A member of the Presbyterian Church of Easton, he served as an elder for many years. He was a volunteer for the Blood Bank of Delmarva, the Regional Cancer Center, the Dept. of Veterans Affairs Health Care, and was a driver for the American Legion, driving local veterans to Perry Point and Salisbury for health care services. He was a life member of the American Legion in Cambridge, a former member of the Trappe Lions Club and a former member of the Masonic Lodge in Pittsburgh, PA.

Mr. Newcomb is survived by his wife, the former Anne Wylie, whom he married January 3, 1942; three children, Philip Newcomb, Jr. and his wife Romie of Severn, MD, Barbara Cooke and her husband Kenneth of Duluth, GA, and Pamela Bowers and her husband Jeffrey of Prospect, PA; four

grandchildren, Suzanne Gregory, Laura Newcomb, Brian Cooke and John W. Powers; and three great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by a brother, Norman Davis Newcomb.

Memorial services will be held on Saturday, October 8, 2005 at 11:00 AM at the Presbyterian Church of Easton.
