Pierre Marshall Pyle, Sr., age 64, of Katy, Texas, went home to be with the Lord on September 9, 2025. A devoted husband, loving father, proud grandfather, and loyal friend, Pierre lived a life marked by courage, service, and unwavering faith. Everyone who knew him loved him, and he, in turn, would do anything for anyone.

Born on March 6, 1961, in Easton, Maryland, Pierre carried within him a deep sense of duty and compassion. Right out of high school, he answered the call to serve his country as a proud United States Marine. Following his military service, Pierre devoted his career to law enforcement, first with the City of Annapolis Police Department and later with the State of Maryland, with the Transportation Authority Police and then with the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission(ATCC). His strength, humility, and integrity left an indelible mark on every community he served.

Even after retirement, Pierre's commitment to helping others never ceased. In Texas, he continued to serve by working with a private K9 security company, and later at the Department of Juvenile Detention, where he partnered with K9s to support young people in rehabilitation - a role that reflected both his compassion and his belief in second chances.

Pierre was also well known for his sharp wit and humor. Friends and family

will fondly remember his running joke about being a Blue Angels pilot, and the way he could bring laughter to any room. Beyond his humor, Pierre will be remembered as a man whose presence made others feel safe, valued, and loved.

His greatest joy, however, was his family. Pierre shared 20 years of marriage with his wife, Laura, who was the love of his life and steadfast partner in every season. Together they raised their blended family of all boys, and he especially cherished his role as “Grumpa” to his four grandchildren - Rowan, Maverick, Ryder, and Willa - delighting in every laugh, milestone, and hug.

Pierre is survived by his wife, Laura; his children Dave Pyle, Pierre Pyle, Jr., Zachary Pyle (Amanda), Bryce Pyle, Tyler Suplee (Christina), and Nicholas Suplee; his beloved grandchildren; and his siblings Beatty Hanson (John), Donald Pyle (Jody) and Michael Pyle. He was preceded in death by his parents, Donald and Iris Pyle.
