Ralph Kennard Jackson of Millington, MD, died Sunday, April 4, 2010, at Chestertown Nursing and Rehab in Chestertown, MD. He was 88.

Ralph K. Jackson was born March 24, 1922 in Millington, the son of the late Harvey A. and Julia A. Hay Jackson.
