



Raymond Leed Rabbe

August 11, 1927 - December 13, 2015

Raymond Leed Rabbe, 88, of Easton, MD, died on Sunday, December 13, 2015, at Bayleigh Chase in Easton. He was born in Cincinnati, OH, on August 11, 1927, son of the late Edward Rabbe and Dina Lodwick Rabbe.

Mr. Rabbe attended Hope College in Holland, MI, where he received a Bachelor's degree in English in 1948. In July of 1954, he married Judith A. Ayers. He taught high school English throughout his career until retiring in 1986 from North Dorchester High School. During the summer months, Mr. Rabbe worked as a dock master at the Maritime Museum in St. Michaels, MD. Mr. Rabbe made an undeniable impact on his students, and for over 40 years made a positive difference to members of the community. Mr. and Mrs. Rabbe resided in Alexandria, VA, for 19 years, moving to Easton in 1971. He was a member of Christ Episcopal Church in Easton.

He is survived by a son, David E. Rabbe of Mt. Laurel, NJ; two daughters, Marcy Rabbe Austin, and Dina Rabbe Keane, both of Bel Air, MD; seven grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Judith Ann Rabbe, who died on August 28th of this year and a granddaughter, Megan Paige Keane.
