



Richard "Dick" Walton Blohm

September 15, 1922 - June 3, 2014

Richard Walton Blohm of Chestertown, MD, died on Tuesday, June 3, 2014, at Chester River Hospital Center. He was 91.

He was born in Portland, OR, on September 15, 1922, the son of the late Godfrey C. and Margaret Walton Blohm. He was a graduate of Klamath Union High School in Klamath, OR, Reed College in Portland, OR, and Harvard Business School in Boston, MA, where he earned his MBA. Dick was married on June 13, 1944, to Barbara Hathaway Kellogg-Smith.

He served stateside with the U.S. Army as a 2nd Lieutenant and was honorably discharged. He worked in Washington, DC, with Ford-Lincoln Mercury Motor Corporation and was later sent to develop dealerships in San Francisco, CA. There he soon took a position with Lockheed Corporation, residing in Santa Clara County. During that time, his neighbor and chess mate proudly introduced his son, Steve Wosniak, who was building a computer in his bedroom and eventually was co-founder of Apple.

In 1970, Dick and his wife moved back to the Eastern Shore and the farm her family owned on the Chester River. He would establish a franchise, General Business Service, a computer software program which would keep accounting and business records.

Dick became enamored with the Chesapeake Bay and sailing, visiting all of the tributaries that the Chesapeake touches. He was also a Civil War enthusiast. Dick was a member of the Chestertown Rotary Club and past president as well as a member of St. Paul's Kent Parish.

His beloved wife and best friend predeceased him in 2003. He is survived by his children, Alison Bergen of Worton, MD, Margaret Blohm of Nederland, CO, Randall Blohm of Worton, MD, and Danette Napier of Denton, MD; along with eight grandchildren. He was predeceased by a brother, Philip Blohm.

Services will be held privately. Interment will be in St. Paul's Cemetery.
