July 3, 1921 - January 19, 2011

Richard Kistler Eberts Sr. of Chestertown, MD died on Wednesday, January 19, 2011 at Chester River Hospital Center. He was 89.

He was born on July 3, 1921 in Bethlehem, PA, son of the late Charles T. and Helen Kistler Eberts. Mr. Eberts graduated Liberty High School, class of 1939 and from Lehigh University, class of 1943 with a Bachelor's of Science in Chemistry. He worked on the Manhattan project in New York City for two years during which time he met and married Bertha Wieger. They lived in New York and moved to Morristown, NJ where he worked as a chemist for Allied Chemical Corporation. He worked there for majority of his career until his retirement. He then worked with Hedwin Corporation in Baltimore, MD as a Chemical Engineer for 15 years, during this time they resided in Towson, MD. He retired again and moved to Chestertown, MD in March of 1991 where he and his wife have been residents of Heron Point.

He was a member of the Presbyterian Church of Chestertown, and an elder at the Presbyterian Church in Morristown and Towson. He was a member of the choir at all three churches, The Chester River Chorale, and The American Chemical Society. Mr. Eberts enjoyed ship models and singing as a tenor soloist.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his daughter, Susan Sodano of Tom's River, NJ his granddaughter, Jessica Ann Sodano, and his grandsons, Kenneth Eberts, Matthew Eberts and Brian Sodano. He is predeceased by his son, Richard K. Eberts Jr.
