



## Richard Thomas Hart

April 21, 1953 - August 15, 2020

Richard Thomas Hart died on August 15, 2020 at the Corsica Hills Center in Centreville, MD. Rick, prior to entering Corsica Hills Center in July 2019, lived in Chester, MD for 32 years.

Born in Baltimore, Maryland on April 21, 1953, Rick was the son of the late Arthur Lee Hart, Jr. and the late Anna Barbara Hart (Medenbach). He attended and graduated from Woodlawn High School in 1971. In 1973, Rick joined the U.S. Navy. After completing his training, he served in the foundry of a nuclear submarine repair tender. He was stationed in Scotland and Spain, spending much of his leave traveling to and enjoying various locations in the British Isles and in Europe.

After his discharge from the Navy in 1977, he took courses at University of Maryland. He also became certified as an A.W.S. Welder. Although he planned on a degree in Mechanical Engineering, he realized that he most enjoyed working with his hands. In 1981, he secured a position with Baltimore Aircoil Company in Jessup, MD and worked there as a Manufacturing Engineering Technician until his early retirement in 2010.

Rick enjoyed being outdoors, tending his trees, plants, flowers, and vegetable garden at his house in Chester, MD. He also enjoyed carpentry and tinkering with various machines. Rick liked to be on the water or to visit Fenwick Island, DE, where he had spent most summer vacations since he was a small child. He enjoyed watching sports, such as going to Orioles games or visiting his sister to attend Penn State football games. Before his deafness took the joy

from it, he also loved to listen to music.

He is survived by his sister, Barbara (Hart) Van Horn and her husband, Richard, and a niece, Kristen, of New Mexico and nephew, Matthew, and his wife, Aglika, and their two children, Siana and Nikolai of Washington State. He is also survived by cousins Robert and Anne (Mutziger) Davidson of Maryland, William and Linda Mutziger of West Virginia, and Stephen and Phyllis Mutziger of Illinois.

When the pandemic ends, a celebration of life for his family and friends will be held in the Baltimore area. He will be interred in the Garrison Forest Veteran's Cemetery (Owings Mills) with his parents.
