March 14, 1943 - September 29, 2013

Richard William Marland, Jr., of Chestertown, MD, died September 29, 2013, after a thirteen-year struggle with Alzheimers. He was under hospice care in Stella Maris, Timonium, MD.

He was born on March 14, 1943, in Philadelphia, PA, the son of the late, Richard W. Marland, Sr., and the late, Nancy Klein Marland Suddall. He was a graduate of Marple Newtown High School Class of 1962. Mr. Marland served in the United States Army from 1962 to 1965 and was honorably discharged in 1968.

In 1967, he started Marland Roofing and Siding Company, Inc., a company he owned and operated until 1997 when he retired. He then worked for his son's company, R.C. Marland & Associates for four more years until fully retiring. He married Patricia Mary Morris in 1967. They made their home in Glenn Mills, PA, and spent many weekends and summers at their home in Chestertown where they have been residing full time for the past five years.

Mr. Marland was a member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus as well as the Western Delaware Valley Lions Club. He and his wife enjoyed boating, spending time on the water, especially the Chesapeake Bay. He was an avid racquetball player and enjoyed playing tennis until a few years ago.

In addition to his wife, Patricia Mary Marland of Chestertown, MD, he is survived by a son, R. Christopher Marland and wife, Cindy of Glen Mills, PA; a daughter, Danielle Burkholder and husband, Barry; two grandchildren, Lauren and Brenton Burkholder of Glen Mills, PA; a brother, Robert W. Marland of Broomall, PA; along with two nieces and two nephews.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held on Friday, October 4, 2013, 11 a.m. at St. Dennis Catholic Church in Galena, MD, celebrated by Rev. Leonard Blakely.
