Richard William Myers of Chestertown, MD, formerly of Towson, MD, died on June 11, 2020, at The Resorts at Chester River Manor. He was 78.

He was born in Charleston, WV, on July 12, 1941, the son of the late William Hayes and Rachel Lelia Ketron Myers. He was a graduate of Short Ridge High School in Indianapolis, IN, and earned a Bachelor's of Arts Degree in History in 1965 from Tennessee Wesleyan College.

Mr. Myers worked as a Real Estate Broker and a Mortgage Banker. He was married to Rita A. Draper on December 7, 1991. She predeceased him in July of 2013. 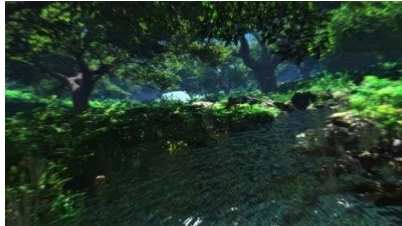

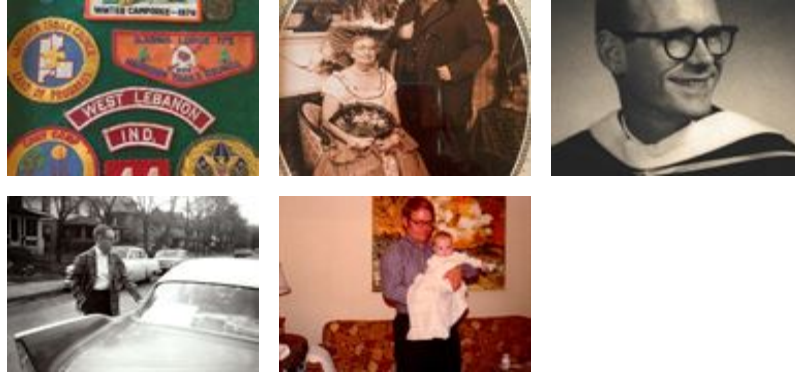
