



Richard Lionel Reish Jr.

November 4, 1949 - December 11, 2011

“Dickey Bird” as his parents and close friends called him was above all else, a “gentle man.” His laughter was contagious and frequent as he navigated life’s challenges with a smile and a quick wit. His nephews knew him as “Uncle Fun” because his mirthful manner and joking nature made every visit comedic. But, however you knew him, you loved him.

The only son of Jane and Richard L. Reish of Philadelphia, PA, he died peacefully on Sunday, December 11, 2011. He is preceded in death by his wonderful parents, Jane Reish and Richard L. Reish and is survived by his loving wife, Linda Reish; his son, Drew Reish (Jaime) of West Chester, PA; his sister, Lynne Earle (Lou) and their children, Drex Earle, Janie Earle and Alex Earle, all of Austin, Texas; and his sister, Katie Dillon (David) and their children, Jonathon Gardner of Austin ,TX, and Sarah Gardner of Philadelphia, PA.

As a youth, Richard spent his summers in Chestertown, MD, where he grew to love the tranquil beauty of the Eastern shore with its boating, fishing and crabbing. He was an accomplished and competitive yachtsman winning his share of medals in local races.

Richard was a devoted and loving husband and father. He and Linda were married in 1977 and were blessed by the birth of their son Drew, the apple of

his father's eye. Throughout his life, Richard and Drew did everything together. Richard was a passionate mechanic and loved to tinker with engines. If it had pistons and cylinders, Richard and Drew would be close by tinkering, surrounded by a gaggle of canine buddies. They were a regular father and son team at the Go Cart tracks outside Chestertown where they competed every weekend they could in the summer.

Richard's love for kids never diminished even after his retirement to Chestertown where he soon became a favorite and beloved coach to the local school's girls' soccer team. Even after his entrepreneurial spirit motivated him to start a pool servicing business, he still found time to volunteer to coach and support fundraising drives at Radcliffe Creek School.

Wherever Richard went, he made an impression. He was an extraordinarily honest, gentle, caring, and humble human being. He had a gift; no matter what the age, people were attracted to him and often would seek him out for company and advice. He always had time to listen. He was enormously optimistic and always focused on the lighter side and the positive angles of things. He also possessed a deep and muted courage that was not obvious until the chips were down and then his inner strength glowed. During his valiant battle with esophageal cancer, he worried more about those around him and then himself.

Richard was a rare and gracious presence in the lives of all those he touched. We love him, and we will miss him deeply.
