August 5, 1943 - January 14, 2021

Richard Curtis Steen passed away peacefully on January 14, 2021, at the University of MD Shore Medical Center at Easton. He was 77 years old.

He was born on August 5, 1943, in Dover, DE, the son of the late Harrison T. and Nell Louise Burris Steen.

Richard served honorably in the U.S. Air Force for four years as SSGT E-5, EOD Specialist. He married the former Linda L. Moore on September 14, 1968, and they made their home in Millington, MD, before moving to St. Michaels in 1976. Richard worked as an insurance representative for 44 years until his retirement.

He was a member of the Methodist Church, VVA, VFW, American Legion, Elks, and the Miles River Yacht Club where he was a Past Commodore and Honored Service Member. He was also Past Commander of the EOD Organization.

He is survived by his wife, Linda L. Steen; son, Troy M. Steen (Leslie); daughter, Stephanie Kealy; grandchildren, Ashby T. Steen, Brodie M. Steen, Mattilin Rose Kealy, and Lily Louise Kealy; brothers, Ron Steen, (Janice) and their family and Ray Steen (Debby); sister-in-law, Donna Moore and her family; and brother-in-law, Rick Moore and his family. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his mother-in-law, Betty Jane Chavies.
