



Richard K. White Jr.

October 31, 1937 - March 15, 2018

Richard Kelly White, Jr., “Tiny,” died peacefully with his family by his side on March 15, 2018, at the University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore.

Born on October 31, 1937, in Lewes, DE, he was the son of the late Elizabeth Constable and The Rev. Richard K. White. After graduating from Episcopal High School in Alexandria, VA, in 1956, he received his B.A. from Washington and Lee University in Lexington, VA in 1960. In 1963, he graduated Cum Laude from The Law School at Washington and Lee, where he was Associate Editor of the Law Review.

At the time of his death, Tiny was affiliated with Miles and Stockbridge, P.C., in Easton, MD. His former professional associations included Partner with the law firm of Piper and Marbury (now DLA Piper) in Baltimore, Managing Director and Senior Vice President of Alex Brown Capital Advisory and Trust Company (now Brown Advisory) in Baltimore, and a Partner and Associate of the law firm of Constable, Alexander and Daneker in Baltimore. Early in his professional career, he served as Law Clerk to The Honorable Raymond W. Horney, Associate Judge, Court of Appeals of Maryland.

Tiny was very involved in the community. He was the Past Senior Warden of the Vestry of Christ Church (Easton) and currently a member of the Investment and Endowment Board of Christ Church (Easton); a Member of

the Finance Committee of Shore Health System; a Member of the Board of Wye River Upper School; a Member of the Board of the Washington and Lee Institute of Honors; Counsel to the Talbot Interfaith Shelter for the homeless and to the St. Vincent De Paul Society of Easton; and also a member of the Boards of a number of private charitable foundations.

Tiny is survived by his wife of 57 years, Ann Kelly White; a daughter, Patricia Constable Teale; a son-in-law, Jan S. Teale; and two grandchildren, Emily Anne Teale and Richard Thomas "Tucker" Teale. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, John Patterson White.

As friends have said, "Tiny's smile will stay with us forever. It is a shy, warm smile that is almost a chuckle and totally genuine and compassionate. Tiny didn't have a mean bone in his body and his smile said it all."

A Celebration of Tiny's Life will be held on Wednesday, March 21, 2018, at 12PM, at Christ Church, 111 Harrison Street, Easton, Maryland 21601. Inurnment will be private.
