Robert Lennon Shufelt, of Stevensville, died Monday, February 22, 2010 at Anne Arundel Medical Center in Annapolis, MD. He was 77.

Mr. Shufelt was born on November 7, 1932 in Hurlock, MD to the late George Franklin Shufelt and Ruth Turner Shufelt. He attended Federalsburg High School and Seaford High School before serving in the U.S. Air Force. After being honorably discharged, he farmed with his father and brothers in Seaford, DE. During his career, he also worked in the chicken equipment business. He founded Calvert Trash in 1980 and retired in 1996. After his retirement, he traveled the world with his wife, Gladys. They visited 6 of the 7 continents.

He was an avid golfer and hunter, dividing his time between their homes in Bay City, Palm Beach Gardens in Florida and their farm in Preston County, West Virginia.
