Lieutenant Colonel Robert Adam "Bob" Carr, 82, of Waynesboro, formally of Maryland, passed away peacefully at his home December 22, 2015. He was born in Encinal, Texas on February 27, 1933, a son of the late Edward and Edith Carr.

Bob proudly served his beloved country during the Vietnam and Korean War as a helicopter pilot (Solopilot) in the United States Army. He received his masters from St. Edwards University in Austin, TX. Bob was a member of the VFW.
