Robert D. Collyer of Fort Myers, FL, formerly of Rock Hall, MD, died Sunday December 19, 1999, at his home. He was 73.

He was born in Rock Hall, the son of the late Samuel Melvin and Gladys Coppage Collyer. He is the husband of 51 years of the late Jeannette B. Collyer who predeceased him December 6, 1999.

Mr. Collyer worked with Peoples Bank of Kent County for 39 years and retired in 1986 as Executive Vice President of the Chestertown location. He and his wife moved to Florida after retirement where they have resided for the past 13 years.
