Robert Tyler Hill, 78, of Easton, MD, died peacefully at his home on Wednesday, January 22, 2014. Bob was born on June 14, 1935, in Des Moines, IA. He was the son of the late Kenneth James Hill and Mildred Tyler Hill.

Mr. Hill was an electrical engineer who spent the majority of his career with the Department of the Navy, specializing in the development of ship-borne radar technology. Recognized as a leader in his field, Bob worked as a consultant and educator for various companies and educational institutions throughout the world after retiring from the Navy Department.

He was a long-time member, supporter and Life Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). He particularly enjoyed his involvement in organizing numerous International Radar Conferences for the IEEE over the course of several decades. Bob served in the United States Air Force after graduating from Iowa State University in 1957. He went on to earn a Master's degree from the University of Maryland in 1967.

Mr. Hill is survived by his beloved wife of 58 years, Jane (Richardson) Hill of Easton, MD; sister-in-law, Suzanne Richardson of Des Moines, IA; son, David of Annapolis, MD; daughter, Lynn (Hill) Sinclair and her husband Ronald Sinclair of Bowie, MD; son, John of Haines, AK; and grandchildren, Ronnie,

Kyle, Kelly, Corinna and Lindy.
