



Robert John Macindoe

September 29, 1930 - November 9, 2015

Robert John Macindoe died at his home in Trappe, MD, on Monday, November 9, 2015. He was 85 years old.

Born in England on September 29, 1930, to Robert Macindoe of Glasgow, Scotland, and Josephine Hopkinson Macindoe of New Castle, England.

At a young age, he immigrated with his parents to America, where they settled in Oxford, MD. He became a member of the Church of the Holy Trinity, where he served as an altar boy. Robert was educated in Talbot County Schools and graduated from Easton High School in 1948. Robert entered the U.S. Army in 1951 and served through 1953. He became a U.S. Citizen after his release from the Army.

Following his military service, he was employed by Mr. Ralph Wiley in Oxford, and became an accomplished wood worker and shipwright. Robert was the operator of sail craft and motor vessels from as far north as Saint Anthony, New Foundland to as far south as Grenada in the West Indies. He later became a Division Operations and Maintenance Supervisor of Navy Sail and Motor Craft at the U.S. Naval Station in Annapolis, retiring in 1998.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Roxanna Walls Macindoe; their sons, Bobby and Colin; his second wife, Patricia Mills

Macindoe; and a brother, William (Bill) Macindoe.

Robert is survived by a brother, Colin Macindoe (Judy); sister, Mary E. Powell; sister-in-law, Beverly Macindoe; son, Dyke Anthony Booze (Linda); niece, Heather Crowder (John); nephew, Neil Macindoe (Jean); grand-nieces, Caroline, Ellie, Katie and Annie; grandson, Brandon Booze; and step-grandchildren, Katelyn, Nicholas, and Christopher.
