



Robert A. Reynolds

November 2, 1932 - April 22, 2014

Robert A. Reynolds, of Oxford, MD, died at 12:55 a.m. on Tuesday, April 22, 2014. He was 81 years old.

Born in Hackensack, NJ, on November 2, 1932, he was the son of the late Wilbur Alfred and Helen Jillard Reynolds. After graduating from Rutherford High School in 1950, he attended Columbia College in New York City where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1954. He then earned a Master of Science degree in Accounting at Columbia Business School in 1955.

Following graduation, he was employed by Becton Dickinson & Co., a medical supply company, in New Jersey. He served in the U.S. Army with the Army Audit Agency from 1956 until 1958. After his release from active duty, he returned to Becton Dickinson & Co. where he remained until retiring in January of 1995 as Vice President of Finance.

After retiring, he moved from Wayne, NJ, to Talbot County where he was an active member of Christ Church in Easton, serving on the Finance and Planned Giving Committees. He served on the Chesapeake Wildlife Heritage Board where he was Treasurer, and a Board Member of the Critchlow Adkins Children's Centers. He was a member of Zion Episcopal Church in Manchester, VT, where they had a winter home, and a former member of St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Wayne, NJ.

His hobbies included photography, international travel and downhill skiing.

Bob is survived by his wife, Phoebe whom he married October 20, 1956 in Granby, MA; a daughter, Sharon Runge and husband Michael of Catonsville, MD; two sons, Thomas Reynolds of Friday Harbor, WA and wife Marie Luz and John Reynolds and wife Valeri of Richmond, MA; six granddaughters, Roxanne Reynolds, Julia Reynolds, Sonali Reynolds, Cecilia Reynolds, Megan Runge, Emma Runge; one grandson, Joseph Reynolds; and a sister, Nancy Dean, who died in 2004.

A Memorial service will be held at Christ Church, Easton, on Monday, April 28, 2014, at 11 a.m.

Private inurnment services will be at Oxford Cemetery, Oxford, MD.

“ Dear Mrs. Reynolds, Tom and the whole family,

I just last night learned of the passing of Mr. Reynolds. Perhaps appropriately, the information came to me while still wearing an adult scout leader uniform, following return from a scout event in Normandy, France. I say appropriately, as it was as a scout leader that I knew him the best, back in the days of Troop 131 in Wayne. Coincidentally, I had thought of him that same day (Sunday) when at the American Military Cemetary, recalling that he was one of the adults I knew who had served in the army in Germany after the war.

Mr. Reynolds clearly had a very rewarding career, family life and community life. But for many of us, it was his role in scouts that touched our own lives most closely. I remember him as adult quartermaster and recall the many camping trips and troop meetings with him. I've always told people that, among the many organizations I have worked with, the most organized was our scout troop when I was young. Mr. Reynolds was very key in that troop, and in fact his affiliation with St. Michael's church, and our strong friendships with his sons, that led many of us to 131.

These are good and cherished memories. I hope that in this time of sadness that you can take some comfort from knowing that these and other memories are kept alive through not only your own family but your many friends.
