



Robert R. Jenkins

August 8, 1933 - September 8, 2010

Easton – Robert Rowe Jenkins died Wednesday, September 8, 2010, at his home.

Born August 8, 1933, in Huron, Ohio, he was the son of the late Robert Leslie Jenkins and Millie Leona Jenkins.

He served as an Officer in the United States Coast Guard. In 1967, he graduated from Lebanon Valley College with an undergraduate degree in Chemistry and graduated from the University of Baltimore, School of Law, in 1975. The decision to practice law was not an easy one. At the age of 38, he attended law school at night while working full-time during the day. His law career began as a staff attorney for an Administrative Law Judge at the Social Security Administration. Prior to opening his own firm, he worked with another attorney in a general civil and criminal law practice. He was the founder of Jenkins, Block & Associates law firm in Baltimore and Cambridge. In 1980, he decided to devote the majority of the practice to Social Security law. He realized that there were people who needed legal representation in the Social Security area. At the time, there were virtually no attorneys helping people obtain Social Security benefits. He served as a Chairperson for the National Organization of Social Security Claimant's Representatives and testified before the U.S. House of Representatives, Committee on Ways and Means, regarding Social Security matters. He was in the Marquis Who's Who in

American Law in 1988-89. He was a lifetime lover of the sea, boating, fishing and gardening. He retired six years ago and moved to Londonderry Retirement Community.

He is survived by his loving and devoted wife of 38 years, Jean D. Jenkins; his brothers, David Jenkins, of Manassas, Virginia, and Michael Jenkins, of Little River, South Carolina; his daughters, Diane J. Cox, of Queenstown, Maryland, Katherine J. Hein, of Ashburn, Virginia, and Deborah W. McKee, of Easton, Maryland; twelve grandchildren; and several great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held on Monday, September 13, 2010 at 11 a.m. at the Redeemer Presbyterian Church, 300 Mill Street, Cambridge, Maryland with a gravesite burial at the Maryland Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery, Hurlock, Maryland.
