Robert W. Clark of Betterton, MD died on September 7, 2008 at Chester River Manor. He was 86.

Born on December 16, 1921 in Clementon, NJ he was the son of the late S. Wayne and Helen Higgins Clark. A veteran of World War II, Mr. Clark served in the Navy and operated a landing craft on Normandy Beach on D Day. Early in his civilian career, Mr. Clark was a tool maker for RCA. After his marriage to Doris Stafford, he managed Laurel Mills Farms, a complete dairy operation and delivered dairy products throughout Camden County, NJ. In 1955, Mr. Clark and family moved to Fair Promise Farm in Betterton, MD, where he continued farming. Mr. Clark enjoyed hunting, fishing and gardening. He was a member of the Farm Bureau, Shrewsbury Church, Lions Club, Frank Jarmon American Legion Post #36, and Flying Farmers. He also served as a Cub Scouts Master.

He is predeceased by a sister, Catherine Overbagh.

In addition to his wife of 59 years, Doris S. Clark, he is survived by a son, Robert W. Clark, Jr. and his wife, Jo; and a daughter, Doris "Sissy" Yowell and her husband, John "Chip" Yowell, all of Betterton; a sister, Margaret Degnan of Beach Haven, NJ; as well as six grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren.

Funeral Services will be held on Thursday September 11, 2008 at 11 AM at Shrewsbury Episcopal Parish. Interment will be at Shrewsbury Cemetery.
