May 4, 1932 - June 27, 2010

Roger Addison Larrimore died at the University of Maryland Medical Center on June 27, 2010. He was 78 years old.

Born in Tilghman on May 4, 1932, he was the son of the late, Addison and Florence Amelia Harrison Larrimore. He graduated from St. Michaels High School in 1949. Then he entered the U.S. Navy and served for 22 years, retiring as a Master Chief Petty Officer. After his military career, he worked for the Virginia Transportation Department in the Bus Garage, retiring after 22 years of service.

Mr. Larrimore was an accomplished woodworker and decoy painter. He enjoyed being on the water fishing and crabbing. He loved to travel and was developing his skills as a photographer. Mr. Larrimore also taught driver safety classes for AARP. He will be fondly remembered for his dedicated work at the Royal Oak United Methodist Church.

He is survived by his wife, Lois Miles Larrimore, whom he married in 1992; his children: Amy Larrimore Parker, and her husband, C.J., Della Larrimore Smith, and her husband, Kenneth; and grandchildren: Jason Parker, Kendell Smith, Addison Smith and Rhiannon Smith. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Eunice Brewer, brother, Webster Larrimore, and first wife, Edith Straughn Larrimore.
