October 4, 1919 - February 27, 2010

Rosa A. Younger of Easton, MD died Saturday, February 27, 2010 at the Hospice Center in Centreville, MD. She was 90.

Born to the late Wilhelm Anselm and Amalia Merz on October 4, 1919 in Horden, Germany, Rosa moved to the US in 1936. Residing with family in Brewster, NY she was employed by Max Dreyfus founder of ASCAP, a recognized New York music publisher. As a staff member at the estate, Rosa met numerous music celebrities' including George & Ira Gershwin, Richard Rogers, Oscar Hammerstein, and Oscar Levant to mention a few. Rosa was also to meet her husband of 67 years, David Younger, during this time; they were married on September 6, 1942. In 1945, they would move to Hanover Hill Farm in Yorktown Heights, NY where they remained until 2001 when they retired to Maryland. Rosa was a devoted wife, mother and ambassador raising two daughters and entertaining an international clientele for Dave's business. Initially they moved to Stevensville, MD; 2005 to Symphony Village in Centerville and finally Easton, MD. She was a devoted member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Yorktown, NY and enjoyed entertaining and giving farm tours to the local school children.

She is survived by her husband of 67 years David F. Younger of Easton, MD; two daughters Carol Y. Johnson of Centreville, MD and Sharon Y. Weis of Syracuse, NY; a brother, Eric Anselm in Germany; 6 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.

A memorial mass and interment in Yorktown Heights, NY will be private. The
