Roy Frasier Martin of Centreville, MD, 84, died on August 12, 2014, at the Queen Anne's County Hospice Center.

Born on January 4, 1930, on Central Pike in Wilson County, TN, he was the son of the late Robert Leroy and Beatrice Eakes Martin. Mr. Martin graduated from Mt. Juliet High School in 1948, where he played fullback for the Golden Bears, was a member of the Beta Club, and received the Balfour Key. He then attended David Lipscomb College in Nashville, TN, before enlisting in the U.S. Air Force in 1950.

He married the former Mary E. Owens of Denison, TX in 1952. After his discharge in 1954, Mr. Martin joined IBM where he worked for 35 years before retiring to Centreville, MD. He continued to work part time, doing taxes, building golf clubs and writing a tax column for the Record Observer.

Mr. Martin was a member of American Legion Post 18. He enjoyed golfing, working in his wood shop, landscaping his home and making wine.

He is survived by his loving wife, Mary Evelyn Owens Martin; his children, Sandra Martin of Sterling, VA, Lisa Cameron of Maywood, NJ, and Robert Edward Martin of Charlottesville, VA; a brother, Robert J. Martin and his wife, Sally, of Albemarle, NC; a sister, Elaine Hill and her husband, Don, of

Birmingham, AL; and grandchildren, Gillian Koch, Devon Koch, Kenneth Romaine, and Alex Martin.

Services will be private.

Interment will be held at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date.
