



Ruth G. Parris

September 13, 1909 - February 28, 2010

Ruth Gabler Parris of Easton, MD, died at William Hill Manor on Sunday, February 28, 2010. She was 100.

Born in Walker, MO, on September 13, 1909, she was the daughter of the late Cecil Andrew and Ivy L. Spitler Gabler. As a child, she moved to Cambridge, MD, where she graduated from Cambridge High School in 1926. She then attended Washington College, before attending Virginia Intermont College in Bristol, VA, where she earned her Bachelor of Arts in English in 1930.

After teaching briefly in Cambridge High School, she was employed by the State of Maryland in the Welfare Office in Cambridge. After attending the University of PA, she worked for the welfare office in Easton. At the close of World War II, she was employed by Hallowell Chevrolet Sales in Easton as a bookkeeper, a position she held until retiring in 1980.

A resident of Easton since 1939, she was a member of Talbot Post #70, American Legion Auxiliary, and a Charter Member of the Ladies of the Elks, Easton Lodge #1622, and the local American Association of University Women.

Her husband, George M. "Pat" Parris, whom she married in 1939, died in 1964.

Mrs. Parris has no immediate survivors. She was pre-deceased by her brother, Linden "Buddy" S. Gabler, of Queenstown.

Memorial services will be held at the graveside at Spring Hill Cemetery, Easton, on Saturday, March 6, 2010 at 2:00 p.m.
