Salvina G. "Subbie" Benjamin of Chestertown, Maryland died on October 12, 2011, at Chestertown Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. She was 87.

She was born in Des Plaines, Illinois on December 28, 1923 the daughter of the late Michael and Clara Oddo Giarrusso. She graduated from high school in Des Plaines and on November 24, 1945 she married John E. "Johnnie" Benjamin. They lived in his hometown of Chestertown where she worked for over 30 years as head teller with Chestertown Bank of Maryland.

Mrs. Subbie was an accomplished artist, creating needlepoint/ cross stitching portraits that adorned her home as well as many of her friends and family's homes. 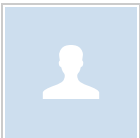
