January 30, 1941 - December 4, 2014

Samuel James Cassidy of Stevensville, MD, died suddenly on December 5, 2014, in Washington, DC. He was 73.

Born on January 1, 1941, in Woburn, MA, he was the first generation of immigrant parents Samuel James Cassidy of Donegal, Ireland, and Rachel Johnston of Glasgow, Scotland.
