Sarah Elizabeth Weimer Meredith of Rock Hall, MD died on August 24, 2008 at her home. She was 83.

Born on November 22, 1924 in Somerset, PA she was the daughter of the late, David J. and Goldie Manges Weimer. A graduate of Somerset High School, Class of 1942 she earned a degree as a registered nurse from the University of Maryland School of Nursing. Mrs. Meredith was employed as a registered nurse with University of Maryland Hospital in Baltimore, MD and Upper Shore Community Mental Health Center in Chestertown, MD.

She was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, Chapter #86 in Chestertown, MD and served as organist at Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church in Rock Hall for a number of years.
