



James Scott Hercik

November 5, 1950 - February 4, 2025

James “Scott” Hercik, 74, passed away February 4th in Reston, Virginia, at home surrounded by his family.

He was born in Alma, MI, son of the late James Joseph Hercik. He is survived by his mother, Luan Olive Hercik, his adoring wife of 43 years, Jeanette Hercik, his loving daughters, Katie (Andrew) Rediger and Christie (Ryan) Manthey, along with his five grandchildren: James Rediger, Mary Rediger, Caroline Rediger, Ruby Rediger and Tommy Manthey. Also surviving him is his sister Jean (Gary) Lustgarten, and sister in- law, Charlotte (Craig) Kierst.

Scott was a graduate of Alma High School, class of 1969. He went on to earn a Bachelor of Science degree at Michigan State University (1973), where he played the trumpet in the Spartan Marching Band. Scott was a nationally recognized transportation expert with a career ranging from Amtrak, State of Michigan Department of Transportation, the Federal Appalachian Regional Commission and the Smithsonian. His love of travel and his adventurous spirit shaped a career and personal life dedicated to seeing the world, and Scott enjoyed sharing those travel experiences and memories with his family and friends.

Scott was a proud and devoted son, brother, husband, father, and grandfather, who cherished spending time with his family and his dog, Scout; particularly at

his and Jeanette's beautiful home in St. Michaels, MD. Scott served as Vice President of the St. Michaels Historical Museum Board of Directors, which gave him the opportunity to share his enthusiasm for St. Michaels with all who visited the community.

Visitation will be held at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home in Easton, MD on February 15th at 10:00 a.m. to 11 a.m., to be followed by a memorial mass at St. Peter and Paul Catholic Church at 11:30 a.m. All family and friends are welcomed.

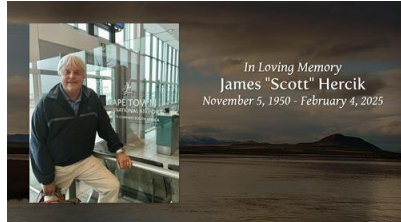

“ I am thankful to have the opportunity to share some thoughts about Scott with you all. Scott was my first boss out of college, at my first real job at the Michigan DOT. I had done some work in my grad school thesis on Amtrak travel patterns, and Scott brought me on to help him with the International and Pere Marquette state supported rail service. It was a great experience, and I met a whole lot of interesting people thanks to Scott. He helped my wife Traci and I settle into Lansing, which was totally unknown to us. When I left MDOT to go west, Scott and I stayed in touch. When I landed at Washington State DOT in the rail program, we checked in regularly to share intel, and the latest Am-news. When Janette and Scott went to DC, we managed to get together occasionally when I came to town. He shared his latest special projects info, and I told him what was going on with the WSDOT rail program. I think it was Spring 1996 we knew the end was coming for the Pioneer train service between Seattle and Denver. We decided to book a trip to ride the route before it was discontinued. It was a memorable trip, with a very late train (late trains get later...) after an unfortunate incident in Pendleton, OR. Nevertheless, the time together was great, and memories were made! Scott was a special person, kind, thoughtful, intelligent, adventurous, and humble. His work throughout the rail passenger industry was notable, and he was a key player in so many projects in the Michigan Rail program. His ability to build consensus and coalitions built the foundation for projects around the country. He was a true servant leader, and he will be missed.
