Shihcheng Stanley Hu, beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend, passed away on June 22, 2025, at the age of 81. He was surrounded by his family at home in Easton, Maryland.

Stanley's life started half-way around the world in 1944 when his mother, Chung-Ching Pai, and father, Kai-Hwa Hu, welcomed him amid political turmoil of the Chinese Civil War. Five years later, as the tides of history shifted, Stanley, along with his parents, brother, and two sisters, relocated to Taipei, Taiwan, in search of safety and opportunity. There, he spent his youth zipping through city streets on his motorbike and dreaming of life in America.

That dream became reality in the 1970s when Stanley arrived in New York City. He found a home in possibility of the American Dream. Eventually, he met the love of his life, Elizabeth Ann, welcomed two children, and established roots in Maryland.

Stanley's passion was caring for his family—often through lovingly prepared, home-cooked Chinese meals. He took great pride in nourishing others, both literally and figuratively, and his warmth and generous spirit were felt by all who knew him.

Stanley will be remembered for his resilience, his kindness, and his playful

sense of humor. He embodied both grit and grace, and his presence was a source of strength and comfort to his family and friends.

He's survived by his wife, Elizabeth Ann; daughter, Lydia, son-in-law, Craig Haughton, grandchildren, Everleigh and Kai; and, son, Andrew, daughter-in-law Janine, grandchildren Carson and Eloise.
