



Shirley Morton Miller

March 6, 1919 - December 12, 2011

Shirley Morton Miller died December 12, 2011, in Easton. She was 92.

Born in 1919, she grew up on South Washington Street in Easton, the daughter of the late, Ivon Tennyson Morton and Mary Margaret Laing. She attended school in the building that now houses the Academy Art Museum and was a member of the first class to graduate from the new Easton High School on Idlewild Avenue. She attended Western Maryland College. After college she worked at Waverly Press in Baltimore.

Shirley was preceded in death by her husband of 67 years, William Robert “Bob” Miller of Baltimore. She is survived by her younger brother, Richard Ivon Morton and his wife, Ella of Trappe; a daughter, Robin Miller Valliant and her husband, Robert of Oxford; two grandchildren, Susan Valliant Hutchison and her husband, Chad, and Michael Robert Valliant and his wife, Robin, all of Easton; and four great-grandchildren, Anna Louise Valliant, Ava Elaine Valliant, Julian Valliant Hutchison, and Samuel Robert Hutchison.

Bob and Shirley built a house in Towson in 1940 and lived there for 62 years before moving to Londonderry in Easton. Shirley was a homemaker, an avid collector and gardener, and a Baltimore Colts fan. She volunteered at the Historical Society of Talbot County, identifying and cataloguing historic photographs and at Tharpe House Antiques.
