May 24, 1937 - February 12, 2012

Shirley Simpkins Taylor of Easton, MD, passed away on Sunday, February 12, 2012, with her husband and children at her side. She was 74.

Born on May 24, 1937, in Mt. Vernon, she was the daughter of the late Doug and Fritz Simpkins. After graduating Washington High School in 1955, she married her high school sweetheart, Jack Taylor, in 1956. Shortly after their wedding, she and Jack spent two years in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, where Jack was stationed in the Navy.

Shirley spent the first half of her married life in her beloved Mt. Vernon. In 1975, she and her family moved to Easton. Shirley was an avid bridge player from an early age and became an ACBL Life Master in 2002. She also enjoyed playing golf and was a member of the Wicomico Chapter of the Eastern Star.

She is survived by her devoted husband of 55 years, Jack Taylor; their three children, Ralph Douglas and wife Michelle, Tracy Lednum and husband Mark, and Leslie Steen and husband, Troy. She loved her seven grandchildren dearly, Alexa, Callie, Stephen, Amie, Ashby, and Brodie; and step-grandson, Richard Barnes, III.

Shirley is also survived by her sisters, Nancy Simpkins Stade and Kathy

Simpkins Beauchamp; brother, J.D. Simpkins; and several nieces, one nephew, cousins, dear friends, and neighbors.
