Shirley Thomas Wyatt of Easton died on Sunday, September 13, 2009. She was 89.

Born on July 25, 1920, in Cambridge, MD, she was the daughter of the late, James Odie and Willie Dorsey Pritchett Thomas. She graduated in the Class of 1937 from Cambridge High School. In March of 1943, she married Henry Orville Wyatt of Easton, MD. She worked for Tubman Jewelers, and in 1947, she assisted in the founding of Wyatt's Jewelers, operating it with her husband until they retired in January 1979.

Mrs. Wyatt was a member of the St. Mark's United Methodist Women's Club, the Ladies of the Elks, the A.A.R.P., the Talbot Country Club, the Gold Room Dance Club, as well as the Crystal Dance Club.

Mrs. Wyatt is survived by one daughter, Barbara Ellen Brogan and her husband, Tom of Arnold, MD. She is predeceased by her husband, Henry Orville Wyatt and one sister, Marcelle Thomas.
